

<p>1 Tuesday 10 August 2021</p> <p>2 (10.00 am)</p> <p>3 (The hearing was delayed)</p> <p>4 (10.25 am)</p> <p>5 Housekeeping</p> <p>6 (In the absence of the jury - extracted)</p> <p>7 (In the presence of the jury)</p> <p>8 MR JUSTICE HILLIARD: Good morning, ladies and gentlemen.</p> <p>9 Let me just tell you what the position is this</p> <p>10 morning.</p> <p>11 Juror number 5 has tested negative herself and has</p> <p>12 no symptoms, but I'm afraid someone in her household has</p> <p>13 tested positive, and that means that she has to</p> <p>14 self-isolate for 10 days and so cannot take part any</p> <p>15 longer. It's very unfortunate and I'm very sorry that</p> <p>16 it's come to this, but I am going to have to discharge</p> <p>17 her. We have to err on the side of caution nowadays, as</p> <p>18 I'm sure you will understand. As I say, she's provided</p> <p>19 a negative test and has no symptoms, but I am satisfied</p> <p>20 that the safe course to do is to discharge her.</p> <p>21 The rules do allow us to do that and to carry on</p> <p>22 without her.</p> <p>23 As I said earlier when we discharged juror number 1,</p> <p>24 it's important that you don't, obviously, communicate</p> <p>25 with her about the case now that I've had to discharge</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Page 1</p>	<p>1 or anything like that.</p> <p>2 All right?</p> <p>3 So there we are.</p> <p>4 First witness.</p> <p>5 DC SIMPSON (sworn)</p> <p>6 Questions by MR HOUGH</p> <p>7 MR HOUGH: Could you please give your name and rank?</p> <p>8 <b>A. I'm Detective Constable Lorraine Simpson. I'm</b></p> <p>9 <b>a Metropolitan Police officer and I work within SO15,</b></p> <p>10 <b>Counter Terrorism Command.</b></p> <p>11 MR JUSTICE HILLIARD: Officer, can I say one thing. One of</p> <p>12 the things we are doing here is we are spread over</p> <p>13 a number of courts so that we keep the numbers of people</p> <p>14 down in any one space, so that means that in this</p> <p>15 building sound, and on occasions film, of the</p> <p>16 proceedings is going to other courtrooms, but sound is.</p> <p>17 I think yesterday there was difficulty in some of the</p> <p>18 other courtrooms in hearing everything that was said.</p> <p>19 Obviously doesn't involve you because you weren't here</p> <p>20 yesterday but it's just important that -- will you just</p> <p>21 do your best to keep your voice up, because a sound that</p> <p>22 is audible in here, that is just good enough for in</p> <p>23 here, may not be good enough for the system to pick it</p> <p>24 up in the other courtrooms.</p> <p>25 THE WITNESS: Yes.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Page 3</p>

But the rules at the moment also indicate that we</p> <p>2 can carry on, so that is what we are going to do.</p> <p>3 So that's juror number 5.</p> <p>4 This is going to sound a bit like a Covid update!</p> <p>5 Mr Menon has to self-isolate. He also has no</p> <p>6 symptoms, he's provided a negative test himself. But in</p> <p>7 his case -- we can do this with an advocate, but I'm</p> <p>8 afraid we can't do it with a juror -- it's possible for</p> <p>9 an advocate to participate remotely and so that's what</p> <p>10 is going to happen so far as Mr Menon is concerned. So</p> <p>11 he will appear over the screen.</p> <p>12 On the same topic, and I hope to reassure you, the</p> <p>13 juror who I discharged earlier has continued to</p> <p>14 provide -- just so you know -- negative tests,</p> <p>15 Wednesday, Thursday, Friday and yesterday, so there's</p> <p>16 nothing to worry about, as we anticipated, on that</p> <p>17 score.</p> <p>18 I'm afraid these are the sort of things that do</p> <p>19 arise with cases at a time like this, but the important</p> <p>20 thing is that we are erring on the side of caution, that</p> <p>21 we are distanced here, wearing masks at court, and so</p> <p>22 on. Of course, to state the obvious, these things are</p> <p>23 unrelated to this extent, it's members in their</p> <p>24 households who have caused the need to self-isolate,</p> <p>25 just so you understand. The common feature isn't here</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Page 2</p>	<p>1 MR JUSTICE HILLIARD: All right.</p> <p>2 MR HOUGH: Can you confirm that you are part of the</p> <p>3 Operation Stylospore team investigating the events in</p> <p>4 which Sudesh Amman was killed?</p> <p>5 <b>A. That's right.</b></p> <p>6 Q. You appreciate you're here to give evidence to help</p> <p>7 present parts of the video compilation prepared by the</p> <p>8 investigation team at the request of the coroner?</p> <p>9 <b>A. That's correct.</b></p> <p>10 Q. We're looking specifically at parts showing events on</p> <p>11 2 February 2020. Can you confirm that these include</p> <p>12 a number of sources of footage: CCTV cameras mounted on</p> <p>13 buildings and inside buildings?</p> <p>14 <b>A. That's correct.</b></p> <p>15 Q. CCTV cameras mounted inside and on vehicles, notably</p> <p>16 buses?</p> <p>17 <b>A. That's correct.</b></p> <p>18 Q. Body-worn video cameras of firearms officers who</p> <p>19 attended the scene after the shooting?</p> <p>20 <b>A. That's correct.</b></p> <p>21 Q. And footage sent in by members of the public who filmed</p> <p>22 it on mobile phones?</p> <p>23 <b>A. That's correct.</b></p> <p>24 Q. May we then move to the compilation and bring it up,</p> <p>25 please. INQ003523, beginning at tape counter 39 minutes</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Page 4</p>

<p>1 and 33 seconds.</p> <p>2 (Video Played)</p> <p>3 We are going to begin with footage at 13.21, 1.20 in</p> <p>4 the afternoon, Sudesh Amman leaving the approved</p> <p>5 premises. So if we can play on, please.</p> <p>6 See him first of all leaving his room, wearing the</p> <p>7 patterned jacket with red hood, light leggings, dark</p> <p>8 beanie hat, and carrying the JD Sports bag across his</p> <p>9 front?</p> <p>10 <b>A. That's correct.</b></p> <p>11 Q. We see him from a number of cameras as he moves through</p> <p>12 the approved premises, downstairs and to the front door.</p> <p>13 We see at this stage that he's walking at a normal</p> <p>14 pace.</p> <p>15 <b>A. That's correct.</b></p> <p>16 Q. See him now walking through an internal door at the</p> <p>17 approved premises and then speaking to a staff member in</p> <p>18 an office through the window.</p> <p>19 See him walking out of the front door; there's</p> <p>20 an internal and then an external view.</p> <p>21 This is now in fact 1.22 pm?</p> <p>22 <b>A. That's correct.</b></p> <p>23 Q. See him then walking across the outside area in front of</p> <p>24 the approved premises onto Leigham Court Road?</p> <p>25 <b>A. That's correct.</b></p> <p style="text-align: center;">Page 5</p>	<p>1 Q. You'll see that he seems to be touching the clothing on</p> <p>2 the left side of his torso, slightly repositioning his</p> <p>3 bag.</p> <p>4 <b>A. That's correct.</b></p> <p>5 Q. And we are seeing another CCTV camera showing him</p> <p>6 walking along a further stretch of Sunnyhill Road</p> <p>7 further to the west, 13.47.</p> <p>8 <b>A. That's correct.</b></p> <p>9 Q. Further along the same road, also at 13.47.</p> <p>10 <b>A. Correct.</b></p> <p>11 Q. In some cases the screen time is wrong, but I'm giving</p> <p>12 the correct time.</p> <p>13 <b>A. That's right, yes.</b></p> <p>14 Q. And the rear view of the same stretch of road.</p> <p>15 <b>A. That's correct.</b></p> <p>16 Q. If we pause here. Pause, please. I think we're looking</p> <p>17 at footage from a Subway shop CCTV camera. We've seen</p> <p>18 Sudesh Amman coming into view through the windows,</p> <p>19 walking from our right to our left.</p> <p>20 <b>A. That's correct. He's approaching the junction of</b></p> <p>21 <b>Streatham High Road.</b></p> <p>22 Q. So he's walking along the last little bit of Sunnyhill</p> <p>23 Road and at the junction with Streatham High Road where</p> <p>24 the Subway is positioned.</p> <p>25 <b>A. That's correct.</b></p> <p style="text-align: center;">Page 7</p>
<p>1 Q. See he's turned right and walked along the road.</p> <p>2 <b>A. That's correct.</b></p> <p>3 Q. We are now going to see clips from cameras showing his</p> <p>4 route, his walk from Leigham Court Road towards</p> <p>5 Streatham High Road. First of all, on Valleyfield Road,</p> <p>6 at I think a corrected time of 1.31 pm.</p> <p>7 <b>A. That's correct.</b></p> <p>8 Q. Again walking at a slow but quite normal pace. And then</p> <p>9 same stretch of road with an alternative view.</p> <p>10 <b>A. That's correct.</b></p> <p>11 Q. I think we're watching another clip of his walking</p> <p>12 further along the same road, correct time being 1.31.</p> <p>13 <b>A. That's correct.</b></p> <p>14 Q. 13.31.</p> <p>15 <b>A. Yes.</b></p> <p>16 Q. We are now going to see CCTV footage of him walking</p> <p>17 along Sunnyhill Road, the long road that leads west</p> <p>18 towards Streatham High Road, at a corrected time of</p> <p>19 13.39.</p> <p>20 <b>A. That's correct.</b></p> <p>21 Q. Again, he's walking slowly but normally.</p> <p>22 I think we'll see him walking along a further</p> <p>23 stretch of Sunnyhill Road to the west of the previous</p> <p>24 view at a corrected time of 13.45.</p> <p>25 <b>A. That's correct.</b></p> <p style="text-align: center;">Page 6</p>	<p>1 Q. I think we'll see him turn, face north on the High Road,</p> <p>2 and then turn to walk south, so further to our left.</p> <p>3 <b>A. Yes.</b></p> <p>4 Q. And we'll hear from the surveillance officers that at</p> <p>5 this point he appeared not to know where he was going.</p> <p>6 <b>A. That's correct.</b></p> <p>7 Q. Play on, please.</p> <p>8 We'll see the same time period view from another</p> <p>9 camera, Sudesh Amman highlighted in a circle at the top</p> <p>10 of the screen.</p> <p>11 <b>A. That's correct.</b></p> <p>12 Q. Walking south on Streatham High Road now.</p> <p>13 Then pause there.</p> <p>14 We are seeing him just continuing that walk south</p> <p>15 along Streatham High Road from a different camera, again</p> <p>16 viewed through the windows of the Subway shop.</p> <p>17 <b>A. That is correct.</b></p> <p>18 Q. Play on, please.</p> <p>19 And pause.</p> <p>20 Now, we are now I think looking at footage from</p> <p>21 a CCTV camera in a food shop called Maeme's Food, where</p> <p>22 one surveillance officer, BX89, was to go a little</p> <p>23 later?</p> <p>24 <b>A. That's correct.</b></p> <p>25 Q. Sudesh Amman highlighted walking past the left of the</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Page 8</p>

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<p>1 screen while he is continuing south on Streatham High 2 Road, correct time being 13.48. 3 <b>A. That is correct.</b> 4 Q. I think we'll see him walk very slowly and looking 5 around himself. 6 <b>A. That's right.</b> 7 Q. Play on, please. 8 Pause here. 9 Now I think we're looking at footage from a CCTV 10 camera of the local council positioned on a post just 11 south of the junction with Sunnyhill Road looking south 12 down the High Road? 13 <b>A. That's correct.</b> 14 Q. Is it right that if we look at the very bottom-left of 15 the screen, we can see a circular red sign with "Grilled 16 Chicken" written on it. I think that's Maeme's, the 17 shop? 18 <b>A. That's correct, yes, it is.</b> 19 Q. The CCTV we were just looking at. 20 Then if we pass our eyes to the right-hand side of 21 the screen, we can see a 250 bus and right next to it 22 a shop with a blue awning over it. Is that the Low 23 Price Store? 24 <b>A. That is, yes.</b> 25 Q. Immediately to the right of that we see some windows of</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Page 9</p>	<p>1 <b>A. That's correct, he is.</b> 2 Q. I think the screen time is correct at 13.50. 3 <b>A. It is, yes.</b> 4 Q. Lights have turned red, traffic, and we see him crossing 5 the road, walking slowly. 6 <b>A. That's right, he is.</b> 7 Q. Seems to wander around a little on the west pavement 8 before heading back north, again very slowly. 9 <b>A. That's correct.</b> 10 Q. Wanders a little to the south of the pedestrian 11 crossing, he's now walking back north. 12 <b>A. That's correct.</b> 13 Q. At 13.53. 14 <b>A. That's correct.</b> 15 Q. See him walking extremely slowly and just pausing there 16 as he went. 17 <b>A. That's correct.</b> 18 Q. Walks north past the Low Price Store at 13.54. 19 <b>A. Yes.</b> 20 Q. And then past the white van. 21 <b>A. That's right, he does.</b> 22 Q. Before passing out of view. 23 And pause here. 24 We are now looking at CCTV footage from a camera on 25 the outside of a Cash Converters shop, which was just to</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Page 11</p>
<p>1 the White Lion pub? 2 <b>A. That's correct.</b> 3 Q. I think we'll see Sudesh Amman highlighted in a circle 4 at some key stages, walking on the left of the image 5 heading south on Streatham High Road at 13.48, after 6 he'd turned into it, and then we'll see him cross 7 Shrubbery Road, where we can see the red car coming out 8 on the right of the image. We can see an arrow there. 9 <b>A. That's correct.</b> 10 Q. Then we see him cross over the High Road at the traffic 11 light a little further to the south near the zigzag 12 lines we can see, before then starting to walk north on 13 the west pavement on the same side as the Low Price 14 Store. 15 <b>A. That's correct.</b> 16 Q. That's what we'll see if we play on. 17 He's highlighted walking past Maeme's in the footage 18 we just saw. 19 <b>A. Correct.</b> 20 Q. See his very slow pace as he crosses Shrubbery Road, 21 back in view and highlighted. 22 <b>A. That's correct, and continues to walk very slowly south.</b> 23 Q. Slightly obscured by the sign, I think around this point 24 he's heading towards the pedestrian traffic light 25 control crossing.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Page 10</p>	<p>1 the north of the White Lion on the west pavement of the 2 High Road? 3 <b>A. That's correct.</b> 4 Q. That shows Sudesh Amman at a time which was in fact 5 13.54.56, coming into view and walking north. 6 <b>A. That's correct, he does.</b> 7 Q. Very shortly after the footage we just saw a few seconds 8 after. 9 <b>A. That right.</b> 10 Q. You'll note that his slow pace continues, and that he 11 passes out of view going north for a short time. 12 <b>A. That's correct.</b> 13 Q. Play on, please. 14 We'll hear that when he passes out of view he goes 15 to outside a Lidl shop and in fact turns around 16 360 degrees. 17 <b>A. That's right, he does.</b> 18 Q. You'll see him come back into view, a screen time just 19 now of 14.00.29, correct time 13.55.27, walking south 20 again on the High Road at a very slow pace again. 21 <b>A. That's correct.</b> 22 Q. Now just 13.56. 23 <b>A. That's correct.</b> 24 Q. Pause here. 25 Once again we're looking at footage from the council</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Page 12</p>

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<p>1 CCTV camera on the post just at Sunnyhill Road, looking 2 south, with the Low Price Store on the right just 3 obscured behind that 255 single-decker bus. 4 <b>A. That's right.</b> 5 Q. The times are correct, so it's 13.56.41. 6 <b>A. That's right.</b> 7 Q. We'll see Sudesh Amman come into view in a couple of 8 seconds walking south on the west pavement, before we 9 see him at 13.56.53 go into the Low Price Store and out 10 of view. 11 <b>A. That's correct.</b> 12 Q. Play on, please. 13 Looked around him, and then he's turning into the 14 Low Price Store. 15 <b>A. That's correct.</b> 16 Q. 13.57.34, you'll see one of the surveillance officers, 17 BX87, moving towards the Low Price Store. 18 <b>A. That's correct.</b> 19 Q. If we pause here. 20 Pause, please. 21 Move our eyes south from the Low Price Store and see 22 a white car coming out of a road to the right of 23 Streatham High Road. 24 <b>A. That's correct. I think that's Prentis Road.</b> 25 Q. Prentis Road.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Page 13</p>	<p>1 by the time he ran out. 2 <b>A. That's correct.</b> 3 Q. Now -- play on, please. 4 Pause there. 5 Did we see a staff member come out of the shop 6 following Sudesh Amman? 7 <b>A. That's correct, he does.</b> 8 Q. If we look to the right of the screen, just halfway in 9 and out of the screen, that staff member is just bending 10 down, I think, to pick up the knife packaging which 11 Sudesh Amman has dropped? 12 <b>A. That's correct, he does.</b> 13 Q. We can see BX87 with the arrow on him just outside the 14 Low Price Store now breaking into a run. 15 <b>A. That's correct.</b> 16 Q. With a bag over his shoulder. 17 <b>A. That's correct.</b> 18 Q. You'll see him increase his speed and running fast after 19 Sudesh Amman from that point. 20 <b>A. That's right, he does.</b> 21 Q. During the seconds that follow we know that Sudesh Amman 22 stabs the woman with the bike, and a man. Those 23 stabbings aren't captured in any footage we have. 24 <b>A. That's correct.</b> 25 Q. Is this right, also at 13.57.59, so in about 6 seconds</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Page 15</p>
<p>1 I think we'll see BX87 walking towards the Low Price 2 Store, directly behind a woman with a bike? 3 <b>A. That's correct.</b> 4 Q. That was -- that woman was subsequently to be stabbed in 5 the attack. 6 <b>A. That's correct.</b> 7 Q. Play on, please. 8 The lady with the pinkish red jacket on the bike, 9 walking north. Then we can just see, coming around the 10 corner with his face obscured, BX87 is moving forward. 11 <b>A. That's correct, he is.</b> 12 Q. With the aim of getting a view of Sudesh Amman in the 13 store. 14 <b>A. That's correct. And there's also a surveillance officer</b> 15 <b>(overspeaking) --</b> 16 Q. Pause there. 17 <b>A. -- up in a restaurant over there.</b> 18 Q. Now, I think we have just seen 13.57.46, so 13.57.48, 19 Sudesh Amman come out of the store. 20 <b>A. That's correct.</b> 21 Q. Can we just wind back by a few seconds in order to see 22 that again. We see the speed at which he comes out. 23 Keep our eyes on the store for the time of 13.57.48. 24 You see the speed with which he comes out. You'll then 25 see him and BX87 marked to show how close BX87 had got</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Page 14</p>	<p>1 after the frame we see now, we'll see BX89 run out of 2 Maeme's on the left of the screen? 3 <b>A. That's correct.</b> 4 Q. And further back down the same road as BX89, you'll see 5 BX69 also begins to move and then run north. 6 <b>A. That's correct.</b> 7 Q. Past Maeme's. I think we'll then see BX114 on 8 a motorbike come out of Shrubbery Road, the road just 9 beyond Maeme's? 10 <b>A. That's correct.</b> 11 Q. And then a little later we'll see BX76, but I'll pause 12 before that. 13 But if we play on, BX87 is running up the road. 14 Now, BX89 has just run out of Maeme's. BX69, a further 15 south position, is starting to pick up speed, and go 16 north as well. 17 <b>A. That's correct.</b> 18 Q. The motorbike will come out in a second from Shrubbery 19 Road, marked there, BX114. 20 <b>A. That's correct.</b> 21 Q. Pause there, please. 22 At 13.59, some seconds after the shooting has 23 happened to the north, you'll see BX76 walking north on 24 the west pavement just south of the Low Price Store. He 25 will be marked and then he'll break into a run by the</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Page 16</p>

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1 White Lion.  
 2 **A. That's correct.**  
 3 Q. Play on, please.  
 4 Pause.  
 5 Go back to the start of that and then pause.  
 6 Pause here with the screens. Yes.  
 7 Just so the jury are reassured, we will see relevant  
 8 parts of this footage again with each of the witnesses,  
 9 so they don't need to have perfect recall of everything  
 10 they are seeing. There's a lot of fast-moving events on  
 11 this.  
 12 MR JUSTICE HILLIARD: Yes.  
 13 MR HOUGH: We are now going to see once again footage from  
 14 the CCTV camera on the outside of Cash Converters, the  
 15 shop we saw was on the same side as the Low Price Store  
 16 and just to the north of it.  
 17 **A. That's correct.**  
 18 Q. The time on screen is just over five minutes fast.  
 19 **A. That's correct.**  
 20 Q. We'll see 13.58, Sudesh Amman running past, having  
 21 stabbed the two people in the seconds preceding these  
 22 images.  
 23 **A. That's correct.**  
 24 Q. We'll see him followed by BX87, with his features  
 25 obscured.

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1 **A. That's correct.**  
 2 Q. We'll then see a man wearing a dark coat and holding his  
 3 side. That's the second person stabbed by Sudesh Amman?  
 4 **A. That's correct.**  
 5 Q. And then we'll see BX75 running past, who was the next  
 6 officer to go in pursuit of Sudesh Amman?  
 7 **A. That is correct.**  
 8 Q. Then we'll see assistance given to the man who had been  
 9 stabbed.  
 10 **A. That's right.**  
 11 Q. Play on, please.  
 12 Sudesh Amman running past, followed by BX87.  
 13 **A. That's right.**  
 14 Q. The injured man holding his side.  
 15 Then, just saw BX75 run past.  
 16 **A. That's right.**  
 17 Q. People in a blue car just pulled up to assist, and  
 18 I think we'll hear from one of those.  
 19 **A. Correct.**  
 20 Q. Pause.  
 21 We are now, I think, looking at footage from  
 22 an internal CCTV camera within Holland & Barrett, a shop  
 23 to the north of Cash Converters and just to the south of  
 24 Boots where the final confrontation took place.  
 25 **A. That's correct.**

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1 Q. We're seeing footage at 13.58 which has been slowed  
 2 down.  
 3 **A. That's correct.**  
 4 Q. And we're seeing Sudesh Amman running past. We can just  
 5 see him to the left of the "Push" sign on the door,  
 6 running past.  
 7 **A. That's right.**  
 8 Q. Followed by BX87, and then BX75.  
 9 **A. That's correct.**  
 10 Q. Play on, please.  
 11 This is slowed footage. We saw there their arms  
 12 were up at shoulder level?  
 13 **A. That's correct.**  
 14 Q. And aiming.  
 15 Pause here.  
 16 We are now, I think, going to see internal footage,  
 17 footage from an internal CCTV camera within Boots just  
 18 to the north of the Holland & Barrett store whose  
 19 footage we saw a moment ago.  
 20 **A. That's correct.**  
 21 Q. Time on the screen is an hour and 39 seconds fast, so  
 22 the footage actually begins at 13.57.58.  
 23 **A. That is correct.**  
 24 Q. I think we'll first see worried pedestrians starting to  
 25 rush into the store from the pavement. Looking south to

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1 the right of the image, the events which are taking  
 2 place, which obviously we know include the stabbing.  
 3 **A. That's correct.**  
 4 Q. Then we'll pause after we see that, so play on, please.  
 5 Pause.  
 6 Now we'll see at screen time 14.58.47, real time  
 7 13.58.08, Sudesh Amman run across from right to left,  
 8 we'll see him stop and turn around. We'll see, only  
 9 just, BX87 and BX75 to the right of the image.  
 10 **A. That's correct.**  
 11 Q. With their arms held in the firing position. We'll then  
 12 see him move towards them and then see him fall as the  
 13 shots strike him. Then we'll repeat the same -- we'll  
 14 look at the same section of footage.  
 15 **A. That's correct.**  
 16 Q. Play on, please.  
 17 Pause there.  
 18 I think we saw Sudesh Amman move towards them with  
 19 the knife held out in his right hand.  
 20 **A. That's correct.**  
 21 Q. Closing already quite a short distance between them.  
 22 **A. That's correct, and the vehicle just pulled up with**  
 23 **BX113.**  
 24 Q. I was going to ask you about that. That car which we  
 25 can see trisected by the metal areas of the two sliding

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<p>1 doors, BX113's Audi car, grey Audi car, which is coming 2 across the road as we heard yesterday. 3 <b>A. That's correct.</b> 4 Q. May we move back to tape counter 57.32. 57 minutes and 5 32 seconds. We'll see this section of footage again, 6 just to see the movements of Sudesh Amman and the 7 officers in that confrontation.
