

<p>1 Thursday, 12 August 2021 2 (The hearing was delayed) 3 (10.10 am) 4 (In the presence of the jury) 5 MR JUSTICE HILLIARD: Good morning. 6 MR HOUGH: Morning, sir. The first witness is Jagmon Singh. 7 MR JUSTICE HILLIARD: Thank you. 8 JAGMON SINGH (affirmed) 9 Questions by MR MOSS 10 MR MOSS: Can you please state your name? 11 <b>A. Jagmon Singh.</b> 12 Q. Mr Singh, you can sit or stand, whatever is more 13 comfortable, but whatever you are doing, please speak 14 into the microphone. 15 I am going to ask questions first on behalf of the 16 coroner. I think you understand there may be other 17 questions asked of you afterwards. 18 It's right, is it, that in February 2020 you worked 19 at the Low Price Store on Streatham High Road? 20 <b>A. Yes, that's right.</b> 21 Q. Do you still work there? 22 <b>A. No, not any more.</b> 23 Q. At the time it was run by your brother, I think? 24 <b>A. Now it's run by my brother.</b> 25 Q. It still is run by your brother?</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Page 1</p>	<p>1 Q. And if we go to page 13, we've carried on in the same 2 direction and that's the back half of the shop, isn't 3 it? 4 <b>A. Yes.</b> 5 Q. Is it right that it's particularly narrow, the back of 6 the shop? 7 <b>A. Yes.</b> 8 Q. If we please go to page 31 of this document. The person 9 taking the photo has turned around now and they're 10 facing back towards the door, but they're standing right 11 at the back of the shop, aren't they? 12 <b>A. Yes, that's right.</b> 13 Q. And if we please to a new document, INQ2258, page 1 14 of that. 15 That's now further forwards, so we're standing in 16 the middle of the shop where it begins to widen out 17 looking at the front door? 18 <b>A. Yes, that's right.</b> 19 Q. If we go to page 3, we can see Maeme's Chicken, the 20 yellow and red shop through the door out the front? 21 <b>A. Yes.</b> 22 Q. On the left-hand side there, is that where knives and 23 other kitchen implements are displayed? 24 <b>A. Yes.</b> 25 Q. If we please look at INQ2267, page 8, we're now looking</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Page 3</p>
<p>1 <b>A. Yes.</b> 2 Q. As the jury has seen and heard, the Low Price Store 3 sells a variety of hardware items? 4 <b>A. Yes, they do.</b> 5 Q. The shop is a really long, thin shop isn't it? 6 <b>A. Yes.</b> 7 Q. I think you say in your statement it's in fact 8 22 metres? 9 <b>A. Yes, that's right.</b> 10 Q. I'm going to show you some photographs of the shop 11 first, to put your evidence in context, and they will 12 come up on the screen in front of you. If we can first 13 see INQ2259, page 1. 14 So that's a photo, isn't it, standing outside the 15 store? In fact, standing in the road looking at it? 16 <b>A. Yes, that's right.</b> 17 Q. And if we go to page 4, have we stepped forward then so 18 we're standing in the doorway looking into your shop? 19 <b>A. Sorry?</b> 20 Q. We've stepped forward and we're standing in the doorway 21 now? 22 <b>A. Yes, yes, that's right.</b> 23 Q. And if we go to page 7, we're further in again and we're 24 next to the till? 25 <b>A. Yes.</b></p> <p style="text-align: center;">Page 2</p>	<p>1 at that display of knives but from the other side, 2 aren't we? 3 <b>A. Yes.</b> 4 Q. We can see there right in the middle of the photo 5 there's a lilac or pink-coloured knife? 6 <b>A. Yes.</b> 7 Q. Around that there are other knives, aren't there? 8 <b>A. Yes.</b> 9 Q. Finally, if we go to page 9, we'll see a different angle 10 of those knives in close-up. So that's where the knives 11 were displayed in the store; is that right? 12 <b>A. Yes, that's right.</b> 13 Q. On 2 February 2020 -- we can take that photo down 14 please. On 2 February, you were at work. Were other 15 staff working with you? 16 <b>A. No, nobody was.</b> 17 Q. Where were you shortly before 2.00? 18 <b>A. In the shop, in the middle of the shop where they -- we 19 called the left-hand side.</b> 20 Q. And did there come a time when you saw some customers 21 who were outside the shop? 22 <b>A. I just was looking and the -- standing nearby the till.</b> 23 Q. Yes. 24 <b>A. And two other customers was looking my display boxes, 25 plastic boxes, so I invite them to inside, come inside</b></p> <p style="text-align: center;">Page 4</p>

<p>1 <b>and have a look, we got more sizes.</b></p> <p>2 Q. This is a man and a woman who were regular customers to</p> <p>3 your shop?</p> <p>4 <b>A. Yes.</b></p> <p>5 Q. So they did come inside.</p> <p>6 Did anybody else come into your shop?</p> <p>7 <b>A. First they come, and after that one Brazilian lady, she</b></p> <p>8 <b>come.</b></p> <p>9 Q. Okay.</p> <p>10 <b>A. He tried to change his mop head, because which is the</b></p> <p>11 <b>wrong size for them, and she change it and whatever</b></p> <p>12 <b>difference she like to pay, she agree with that and</b></p> <p>13 <b>say -- she was on the till.</b></p> <p>14 Q. Did a younger man come into the shop as well?</p> <p>15 <b>A. Yes, yes.</b></p> <p>16 Q. When did he come into the shop?</p> <p>17 <b>A. He come after like that, two customers, black and -- man</b></p> <p>18 <b>and lady, after like nearly half -- five to six minutes.</b></p> <p>19 Q. So the black man and lady came in; those are your</p> <p>20 regular customers?</p> <p>21 <b>A. Yes.</b></p> <p>22 Q. Then the younger man came in?</p> <p>23 <b>A. After five to six minutes.</b></p> <p>24 Q. Then the Brazilian woman comes in after that?</p> <p>25 <b>A. Yes.</b></p> <p style="text-align: center;">Page 5</p>	<p>1 where it begins to narrow?</p> <p>2 <b>A. Yes, further down, like the left-hand side.</b></p> <p>3 Q. Maybe where we can see that black suitcase that's</p> <p>4 sticking out in the middle there?</p> <p>5 <b>A. Yes.</b></p> <p>6 Q. Then the man in the green beanie, who we know is</p> <p>7 Mr Amman, he is somewhere between the two of you,</p> <p>8 between you and the customers?</p> <p>9 <b>A. Yes, he's standing nearby the black suitcase, left-hand</b></p> <p>10 <b>side. He was standing there.</b></p> <p>11 MR JUSTICE HILLIARD: Just tell us, what is the display</p> <p>12 there? What sort of things are where he was? Do you</p> <p>13 know? Perhaps you can't remember.</p> <p>14 <b>A. I can't remember.</b></p> <p>15 MR JUSTICE HILLIARD: That's all right.</p> <p>16 MR MOSS: If we were to go to page 7 of this document, maybe</p> <p>17 that will help us place him. We've stepped a bit</p> <p>18 further into the shop, I think. So he's somewhere</p> <p>19 between us and that black suitcase, is he?</p> <p>20 <b>A. Yes, left-hand side.</b></p> <p>21 Q. What was he doing while he was there?</p> <p>22 <b>A. He was -- tried to -- he had seen something over there</b></p> <p>23 <b>because some knives we had displayed in a block, like</b></p> <p>24 <b>come in a box in a block. On the left-hand side in the</b></p> <p>25 <b>shelf you can see it.</b></p> <p style="text-align: center;">Page 7</p>
<p>1 Q. Let's look at the younger man. Can you tell us about</p> <p>2 him? What was he wearing?</p> <p>3 <b>A. He was wearing like a hoodie and a green beanie, jacket</b></p> <p>4 <b>something, and the trouser I think is a black colour,</b></p> <p>5 <b>and black shoes.</b></p> <p>6 Q. When the man in the green beanie came into the shop,</p> <p>7 where were the man and the woman, the regular customers?</p> <p>8 <b>A. They were outside and there was your left-hand side,</b></p> <p>9 <b>which you see the narrow place, they're standing over</b></p> <p>10 <b>there watching the boxes, and this young man can't go</b></p> <p>11 <b>through it, so he stopped there for like two to three</b></p> <p>12 <b>minutes to look around.</b></p> <p>13 Q. Inside the store or --</p> <p>14 <b>A. Yes, inside the store.</b></p> <p>15 Q. Inside the store, so if we were to look at INQ2259 --</p> <p>16 MR JUSTICE HILLIARD: Can you just help us for our</p> <p>17 purposes -- the witness won't know, but is this Mr Amman</p> <p>18 who went --</p> <p>19 MR MOSS: It is.</p> <p>20 MR JUSTICE HILLIARD: All right, good.</p> <p>21 MR MOSS: If we look at INQ2259, page 4, please.</p> <p>22 Is it right that you were standing about there in</p> <p>23 the doorway?</p> <p>24 <b>A. Yes.</b></p> <p>25 Q. And the regular man and woman were further down the shop</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Page 6</p>	<p>1 Q. So near to where he was standing --</p> <p>2 <b>A. Yes.</b></p> <p>3 Q. -- on the left-hand side of that image there are some</p> <p>4 knives?</p> <p>5 <b>A. Knives also there, yes.</b></p> <p>6 Q. Particularly knives in the knife block?</p> <p>7 <b>A. Yes.</b></p> <p>8 Q. Did you speak to him?</p> <p>9 <b>A. I ask him, "Would you like any help?" And he didn't</b></p> <p>10 <b>answer nothing. Because normally I ask my customers.</b></p> <p>11 Q. It's normal for you to say, "Do you want any help?"</p> <p>12 <b>A. Yes. I ask for any customer, "Would you like any help?"</b></p> <p>13 <b>So he didn't answer nothing.</b></p> <p>14 Q. He said nothing to you at all?</p> <p>15 <b>A. Nothing. He didn't reply nothing.</b></p> <p>16 Q. What did you think about him?</p> <p>17 <b>A. I think might be he was look strange to me, is something</b></p> <p>18 <b>I doubt, so I was still watching him.</b></p> <p>19 Q. You say in your witness statement that you thought he</p> <p>20 was mentally disturbed --</p> <p>21 <b>A. Yes, it looked like --</b></p> <p>22 Q. -- as he didn't say anything to --</p> <p>23 <b>A. Yes, he didn't say. But he's -- disturbed. He's</b></p> <p>24 <b>looking disturbed.</b></p> <p>25 Q. He looks disturbed?</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Page 8</p>

<p>1 <b>A. Yes.</b></p> <p>2 Q. Did you then move on to serve another customer at the</p> <p>3 till, the Brazilian lady?</p> <p>4 <b>A. Yes.</b></p> <p>5 Q. Did you see at that time what the man in the green</p> <p>6 beanie was doing?</p> <p>7 <b>A. He -- he come back again. He just turn, like turn back.</b></p> <p>8 <b>Because where the knife were display, I was standing</b></p> <p>9 <b>there, and there -- another Brazilian lady looking for</b></p> <p>10 <b>the mop in the shelf, she tried to bring back the mop</b></p> <p>11 <b>head for me, and as soon as I moved to the till, he come</b></p> <p>12 <b>back and grabbed the knife.</b></p> <p>13 Q. So to summarise, he's further down the store looking at</p> <p>14 the knife blocks.</p> <p>15 <b>A. Yes.</b></p> <p>16 Q. You're at the till helping the Brazilian lady who is</p> <p>17 exchanging the mop, and at that point the man in the</p> <p>18 green beanie turns around and he looks to the other</p> <p>19 display of knives, which is the display that's next to</p> <p>20 you at the till?</p> <p>21 <b>A. That's right.</b></p> <p>22 Q. Did he go towards that display of knives at the till?</p> <p>23 <b>A. Not -- I didn't --</b></p> <p>24 Q. There are the knives next to you at the till. Did the</p> <p>25 man in the green beanie come towards them?</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Page 9</p>	<p>1 <b>catch him, but he take it out the knife from its</b></p> <p>2 <b>packaging, and he stabbed the lady in front of me.</b></p> <p>3 Q. When was it that you tried to catch him?</p> <p>4 <b>A. When he took the knife and run away outside the shop.</b></p> <p>5 Q. Were you inside the store or outside the store --</p> <p>6 <b>A. No, I was inside on the till to serve the Brazilian</b></p> <p>7 <b>lady.</b></p> <p>8 Q. But when it was that you tried to catch him, when you</p> <p>9 put your hand out for him --</p> <p>10 <b>A. Yes, I'm on the till, because it's a narrow -- can't</b></p> <p>11 <b>go -- you don't have a space to go outside so quickly,</b></p> <p>12 <b>so I tried to grab his hand and he did something like</b></p> <p>13 <b>that. Run away.</b></p> <p>14 Q. Once he was outside the store --</p> <p>15 <b>A. Yes.</b></p> <p>16 Q. -- did you continue to follow him?</p> <p>17 <b>A. Yes.</b></p> <p>18 Q. How far did you follow him for?</p> <p>19 <b>A. After like 10 yards from the shop left-hand side.</b></p> <p>20 Q. Did you see where he was when he got the knife out of</p> <p>21 the packaging? Was he in the store or was he --</p> <p>22 <b>A. Outside the store.</b></p> <p>23 Q. So when he got outside the store the knife was still in</p> <p>24 the packaging, and he then removed it from the packaging</p> <p>25 while on the pavement?</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Page 11</p>
<p>1 <b>A. Yes, towards them. He just grabbed and run away.</b></p> <p>2 Q. Did he stop at that display?</p> <p>3 <b>A. I -- I tried to --</b></p> <p>4 Q. Sorry, did the man in the green beanie stop when he got</p> <p>5 to where the knives are on display or did he just grab</p> <p>6 it as you described --</p> <p>7 <b>A. He just grabbed them.</b></p> <p>8 MR JUSTICE HILLIARD: He grabbed it and ran away?</p> <p>9 <b>A. Yes.</b></p> <p>10 MR MOSS: Can you describe the knife that he grabbed?</p> <p>11 <b>A. It's like a 10-inch long, like a silver terracot -- like</b></p> <p>12 <b>it's a granite coating on the top of it, and the actual</b></p> <p>13 <b>like long size, it's 10 inch long.</b></p> <p>14 Q. You describe it in your statement as a straight</p> <p>15 stainless steel blade?</p> <p>16 <b>A. Yes.</b></p> <p>17 Q. When you saw that happening, what did you think he was</p> <p>18 doing?</p> <p>19 <b>A. He just take and run away outside the shop.</b></p> <p>20 Q. Did you do anything?</p> <p>21 <b>A. Pardon?</b></p> <p>22 Q. Did you do anything?</p> <p>23 <b>A. No, no.</b></p> <p>24 Q. What did you do? Did you --</p> <p>25 <b>A. I just ran after him, and after 10 yard I just tried to</b></p> <p style="text-align: center;">Page 10</p>	<p>1 <b>A. Yes.</b></p> <p>2 Q. He turned left when he came out of the store?</p> <p>3 <b>A. Yes.</b></p> <p>4 Q. And you turned left and you've gone about 10 yards after</p> <p>5 him?</p> <p>6 <b>A. Yes.</b></p> <p>7 Q. What did he then do?</p> <p>8 <b>A. He take it out the knife from the packaging, and on the</b></p> <p>9 <b>same time the -- another lady's turning right-hand side,</b></p> <p>10 <b>he stabbed the knife in his back, and --</b></p> <p>11 Q. In the lady's back?</p> <p>12 <b>A. Yes.</b></p> <p>13 Q. Did you see how many times he --</p> <p>14 <b>A. Only one time.</b></p> <p>15 Q. Just one time.</p> <p>16 You say in your statement that he was holding the</p> <p>17 knife in his right hand?</p> <p>18 <b>A. Yes.</b></p> <p>19 Q. I think that's right. How was he holding the knife?</p> <p>20 Can you describe where his arm was when he was doing</p> <p>21 that?</p> <p>22 <b>A. It's like that. (Demonstrates)</b></p> <p>23 Q. So his right arm was out to his side?</p> <p>24 <b>A. Yes.</b></p> <p>25 Q. And you're describing his hand up at shoulder height?</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Page 12</p>

<p>1 <b>A. Yes.</b></p> <p>2 Q. And he's pointing the knife blade directly in front of</p> <p>3 him; is that right?</p> <p>4 <b>A. Yes.</b></p> <p>5 Q. Did he say anything?</p> <p>6 <b>A. No.</b></p> <p>7 Q. After he stabbed the woman, what did he do?</p> <p>8 <b>A. He run further.</b></p> <p>9 Q. He carried on in the same direction?</p> <p>10 <b>A. Yes.</b></p> <p>11 Q. What did she do?</p> <p>12 <b>A. After that, I couldn't see nothing what he done after</b></p> <p>13 <b>that.</b></p> <p>14 Q. Is it right that you stopped giving chase and then you</p> <p>15 returned into the shop?</p> <p>16 <b>A. Yes.</b></p> <p>17 Q. Did you pick up the packaging?</p> <p>18 <b>A. Yes. Unfortunately I done the mistake, I pick it up</b></p> <p>19 <b>that packaging.</b></p> <p>20 Q. And you took it back with you into the shop?</p> <p>21 <b>A. Yes, into the shop.</b></p> <p>22 Q. When you were in the shop, could you hear anything</p> <p>23 happening outside?</p> <p>24 <b>A. Yes, I heard the bullets shot.</b></p> <p>25 Q. Do you know how many you heard?</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Page 13</p>	<p>1 <b>A. Yes.</b></p> <p>2 Q. Had you seen the man in the green beanie before</p> <p>3 2 February?</p> <p>4 <b>A. Yes, he come one day before. This incident happened on</b></p> <p>5 <b>Sunday, but Saturday he come in the shop and then look</b></p> <p>6 <b>around my shop everything, he go to look round all the</b></p> <p>7 <b>shop, and I still asked them, "Would you like any help?"</b></p> <p>8 <b>And still they didn't give any answer on that day.</b></p> <p>9 Q. How confident are you that it was him that you saw on --</p> <p>10 <b>A. Yes, the same guy. It's the same dress, same thing,</b></p> <p>11 <b>everything.</b></p> <p>12 Q. Did you remember his face?</p> <p>13 <b>A. Yes, yes.</b></p> <p>14 Q. Did you watch him the whole time that he was in your</p> <p>15 shop on the Saturday?</p> <p>16 <b>A. Yes.</b></p> <p>17 Q. The jury has heard evidence that police officers saw</p> <p>18 Sudesh Amman, the man in the green beanie, in your store</p> <p>19 on Friday 31 January. Is it possible that it was the</p> <p>20 Friday that you saw him --</p> <p>21 <b>A. No, Saturday.</b></p> <p>22 Q. You're sure it was the Saturday?</p> <p>23 <b>A. Saturday.</b></p> <p>24 MR MOSS: Thank you, Mr Singh, I have no other questions for</p> <p>25 you. It might be that others do, if you wait there for</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Page 15</p>
<p>1 <b>A. According to me, it's -- I heard three or two. I don't</b></p> <p>2 <b>remember.</b></p> <p>3 Q. Did you know that they were bullets? Were you sure that</p> <p>4 they were bullets?</p> <p>5 <b>A. No. I heard from the peoples around there that</b></p> <p>6 <b>somebody's shot dead down there, so what noise I heard,</b></p> <p>7 <b>it might be the bullets.</b></p> <p>8 Q. So you heard the sound and then later you heard people</p> <p>9 saying what they had seen?</p> <p>10 <b>A. Yes.</b></p> <p>11 Q. And you thought, "Ah, that was bullets that I heard"?</p> <p>12 <b>A. Yes.</b></p> <p>13 Q. Did you look outside when you heard it?</p> <p>14 <b>A. I tried to, but my shop was -- nobody in the shop, so</b></p> <p>15 <b>I went back to my shop.</b></p> <p>16 Q. But is it right that when you looked briefly outside,</p> <p>17 you could see the woman who had been stabbed and you</p> <p>18 could also see a man further up the street who had been</p> <p>19 stabbed as well?</p> <p>20 <b>A. No, I didn't see the further down.</b></p> <p>21 Q. You didn't see the man who had been stabbed?</p> <p>22 <b>A. No.</b></p> <p>23 Q. How did you feel?</p> <p>24 <b>A. That's a -- no.</b></p> <p>25 Q. Were you afraid?</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Page 14</p>	<p>1 a moment.</p> <p>2 MR MENON: No questions, thank you.</p> <p>3 MR MOSS: Sir, unless you have any questions?</p> <p>4 MR JUSTICE HILLIARD: No. Thank you very much. Thank you</p> <p>5 for coming.</p> <p>6 MR MOSS: Thank you for your evidence.</p> <p>7 (The witness withdrew)</p> <p>8 MR HOUGH: Sir, the next witness is giving evidence by video</p> <p>9 link, which means that a screen needs to be put into the</p> <p>10 witness box and she needs to be contacted. I wonder if</p> <p>11 we could have a short break while that is done. You appreciate you are giving evidence about events you</p> <p>4 witnessed as a bystander on Streatham High Road on</p> <p>5 Sunday 2 February 2020.</p> <p>6 You made a statement which you may refer to, if you</p> <p>7 wish. It goes into some details I won't ask you about</p> <p>8 because, as you appreciate, we're focusing on the attack</p> <p>9 by Sudesh Amman and the shooting of Sudesh Amman by</p> <p>10 armed officers.</p> <p>11 On that Sunday afternoon, were you in Streatham out</p> <p>12 shopping with your partner Tom?</p> <p>13 <b>A. I was.</b></p> <p>14 Q. Had you visited several shops in the High Road in the</p> <p>15 period between 1 pm and 2 pm?</p> <p>16 <b>A. I did.</b></p> <p>17 Q. Had you left your car in the Lidl shop car park?</p> <p>18 <b>A. Yes, I had.</b></p> <p>19 Q. I think that was a blue VW Polo car?</p> <p>20 <b>A. It was, yes.</b></p> <p>21 Q. At the end of your shopping trip, did you pick up the</p> <p>22 car and drive it out of the car park?</p> <p>23 <b>A. I did.</b></p> <p>24 Q. To follow your route, may we please put on screen</p> <p>25 a document you have in hard copy there, INQ002682,</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Page 17</p>	<p>1 <b>A. 2 miles an hour, maybe less.</b></p> <p>2 Q. Where was your attention focused before the man came</p> <p>3 out?</p> <p>4 <b>A. Forwards. There was a car in front of me.</b></p> <p>5 Q. As you were in that position, parallel with the shop,</p> <p>6 what did you see?</p> <p>7 <b>A. I saw -- more so I heard a commotion coming to the</b></p> <p>8 <b>left-hand side of me, which then a man ran out of the</b></p> <p>9 <b>shop followed by someone else shouting to stop.</b></p> <p>10 Q. What did you initially think was going on?</p> <p>11 <b>A. I thought it was a robbery, if I'm honest. I thought</b></p> <p>12 <b>he -- I thought it was him running out of the shop after</b></p> <p>13 <b>stealing something. But it wasn't particularly clear at</b></p> <p>14 <b>the time.</b></p> <p>15 Q. Did you look to your left to see what was going on?</p> <p>16 <b>A. I did, yes.</b></p> <p>17 Q. Could you see the man coming out of the store?</p> <p>18 <b>A. Yes, I could.</b></p> <p>19 Q. How far away from you was he?</p> <p>20 <b>A. A metre, maybe two.</b></p> <p>21 Q. Did you notice anything about, first of all, his dress</p> <p>22 or appearance?</p> <p>23 <b>A.
